Reporting on a whole year's work in such short document is difficult and may even be a little unfair. Unfair because some activities have to be left out and because the efforts by so many people cannot be fully acknowledged and because it cannot fully explain the importance of some alliances.

In this Report we have tried to mention the most notable events of 2008. Said year saw significant changes to the professional team and Board, and was also a great year during which we progressed towards our strategic objectives and has brought us a little closer to fulfilling our MISSION and VISION.

This year saw the 60th Anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and UNESCO Etxea participated in this international event with different acts contained in this Report. Particularly important for us was the ceremony to award the UNESCO/Bilbao Prize for Promoting a Human Rights Culture to Stéphane Hessel. We were extremely lucky to meet him and collaborate in the international recognition of a great diplomat and Human Right militant throughout the 20th century. This universal German-French Jew is one of those people who is definitely deserving because he reconciles us with humanity. At 92 he continues actively participating in the defence of Human Rights, sowing hope and dignity.

Throughout the year we worked discretely and continuously on the Basque Plan for Human Rights Education, and on its social and educational support. Neither a broad parliamentary agreement nor a broad social agreement were possible, although we believe that we have made a positive contribution towards building a good base to be completed and improved in the future.

As explained in the Report, we have become one of the worldwide references on the issue of water, we have become consolidated as an important institution on Cultural Rights, broadened our work on the Culture of Peace, languages and immigration, training and information, education and documentation.

On an internal level we have 13 new members which strengthens our social base and our civic and social nature as a non-governmental association. We have partially renewed and enriched our Board of Directors with the incorporation of two new directors, Mr Jon Emaldi and Ms Nieves Fernández. Mr Paul Ortega, who has been part of UNESCO Etxea since 1992, first of all as Manager and then as director, left the Board. We would like to very sincerely thank Paul and acknowledge his contribution.

The Board of Directors approved the 'Labour Relations Framework' document which regulates the labour relations and conditions of UNESCO Etxea's personnel. We consider that a good dynamic labour regulation, with internal agreements and global recognition and fair remuneration for the professionals is essential so that our Association can fulfil its mission and continue growing and improving as an institution.

2009 is going to be a difficult year. The financial crisis is affecting everybody and forces us to be more efficient and productive and to strengthen our commitment to innovation.

It is a year of change at the top of UNESCO, i.e. its Director General. We hope that the change will help to make the institution more democratic and modern, opening more doors to the participation of civil society actors like UNESCO Etxea.

It is also a year of change in the Basque Government. We will have the opportunity to discover new references and to add new sensitivities to our objectives to build a better country in a fairer world. We want our society and our country to participate at the top level in some of the most important global challenges of our time. And we are achieving this with committed members and volunteers and with extraordinary professionals.

Xabier was a Member of the Board of Directors from 2002 to 2008, acting as Secretary between 2002 and 2006.


Paul was Director of UNESCO

UNESCO Etxea establishes a strong link between the Basque Country and the main international organizations, for which it uses two key instruments: its Official Relations Status with

UNESCO, and its Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). Furthermore, UNESCO Etxea is associated with the United Nations Department of



Public Information (DPI). Our Documentation Centre forms part of the UNESCO Network of Associated Libraries (UNAL).

We participate in various UNESCO programmes relating to education, the environment, culture and human rights. We actively collaborate with the Spanish Commission for Co-operation with UNESCO, a public body which answers to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Co-operation.

We collaborate with the United Nations Millennium Campaign on achieving the Millennium Development Goals and with the United Nations Regional Information Centre for Western Europe (UNRIC). We have stable working relationships with the United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR), the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the United Nations Office to support the International Decade for Action 'Water for Life' 2005-2015.

UNESCO Etxea belongs to the Spanish Confederation of UNESCO Associations, Clubs and Centres and to the World Federation of UNESCO Clubs, Centres and Associations (WFUCA).

We have a Collaboration Agreement with the United Nations Association in Spain (ANUE), thanks to which we also cooperate, as a reference in the Basque Autonomous Region, with the World Federation of United Nations Associations (WFUNA).

We are members of CONGO, the Conference of Non-Governmental Organizations in Consultative Relationship with the United Nations, and participate at its annual meetings.

We are the Focal Point in Euskadi of UBUNTU: World Forum of Civil Society Networks and we lead the Basque Committee of the World Campaign for in-depth Reform of the System of International Institutions. We are members of the Spanish Federation of Associations for the Defence and Promotion of Human Rights.

We form part of the European Union Water Initiative (EUWI), and of the Water Group and Climate Change and Combating Poverty Group of the Spanish Development NGO Coordinating Committee (CONGDE), the Network of the Freiburg Observatory for Cultural Rights, the Alianza por el Agua and the network of 120 organizations supporting the campaign for the human right to peace. We collaborate with the COHRE Human Right to Water Programme.

UNESCO Etxea has promoted the establishment of the UNESCO Chairs of Sustainable Development and Environmental Education and of World Language Heritage at the University of the Basque Country, and takes an active part in their initiatives.

We are members of the Board of Governors of the Basque Country Development NGO Coordinating Committee, participating in its Mobilization and Campaigns Team.

We are a founder member of the Forum of Human Rights and Peace Education Associations, and form part of its Management Board.

We maintain a working agreement with IKUSPEGI, the Basque Immigration Observation Group; we collaborate very closely with the University of Deusto's Pedro Arrupe Institute and with the University of the Basque Country's Chair of International Studies; and we work on various projects together with the Basque Group of the Spanish Chapter of the Club of Rome.

We form part of the inter-cultural working group of the European Anti-Poverty Network in the Basque Country (EAPN). We continue to work with the Board of Trustees of the Urdaibai Biosphere Reserve, of which we are active members and allies in various initiatives.



'Multilinguistic and multicultural Management in contexts of immigration and national

This year we contributed, together with the UNESCO Chair of World Linguistic Heritage, to the celebration of the International Year of Languages.

Together with Ikuspegi (Basque Immigration Observatory) we performed extensive research into Languages and Immigration which we presented in May at the 2nd Conference on Languages and Immigration in Bilbao where we worked with important local and international experts. This research was also presented at the summer course on 'Migratory Processes'.

In June we organised a seminar-talk with the prestigious expert Will Kymlicka about multilinguistic and multicultural Management in contexts of immigration and national minorities which was widely attended by public and private agents in the Basque Country.


The Amarauna languages group constituted the Scientific Committee of the International Conference on the Challenges facing Minority Languages in the Age of Globalisation which was hold in Bilbao in October and organised by EUDEL, the Basque Government and the three Provincial Councils.

We coordinated the book 'El futuro de las lenguas. Diversidad frente a uniformidad' (The future of languages. Diversity against uniformity) which includes articles from our team and from other local and international specialists. This work received the recognition of 'Book of the Week' from the Cervantes Institute.

This year we have also extended our international scope and have become very actively integrated into the prestigious Network of the Freiburg Cultural Rights Observatory and collaborating with the work of the Rapporteur on the General Observation of Article 15 (on Cultural Rights) of the United Nations Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights.

HUMAN RIGHTS AND CULTURE OF PEACE



The World Campaign for the Human Right to Peace which we develop together with the SSIHRL continues to progress with significant presence on the United Nations Human Rights Council (three written and oral declarations before the plenary session and three parallel events). This campaign is already supported by over 120 international organisations with consultative status before the United Nations.

We maintain our commitment to Education in Human Rights in the Basque Country where we form part of the Board of Directors of the Foro de Asociaciones de Educación en Derechos Humanos y por la Paz (Forum of Associations Educating in Human Rights and for Peace), and we have also been chosen as representatives on the Consultation Board of the Basque Plan for Education for Peace and Human Rights. We have publicised this Plan, with the aim of obtaining alliances for its improvement, at the top level of the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, UNESCO and the Council of Europe.

We have advanced in practical training programmes to include the Human Rights focus in International Development Cooperation, particularly aimed at the cooperation agents: NGOs and public authorities.

Our work for the development and universal enjoyment of the Human Right to Water has this year advanced significantly: we are recognised in the different state and international networks working on the issue and we have actively collaborated in the process which culminated in the creation within the United Nations of the mandate for an independent expert on the human right to water and sanitation. We are already working closely with this independent expert, Catarina de Alburquerque, to ensure the success of her important mission.

Together with the United Nations Office to support the International Decade for Action 'Water for Life' 2005-2015 we have published a book on the Human Right to Water which has had significant impact. Following the editions in Spanish and in English (and an executive summary in Euskera/Basque), an edition in Portuguese is currently being prepared.

2008 was also the year of the UNESCO/Bilbao Prize for the Promotion of a Culture of Human Rights (see page 15) and the presentation of our work on the Human Right to Water at Expo Zaragoza (see page 14).

SUSTAINABILITY AND ENVIRONMENT

In 2008 we have designed, together with the Basque Water Agency (URA), the United Nations Office to support the International Decade for Action 'Water for Life' 2005-2015, the UNEP and the Millennium Development Goals (MDG) Campaign, an innovative Basque initiative to support Target number 10 of the MDG which states: Halve, by 2015, the proportion of people without sustainable access to safe drinking water and basic sanitation. This initiative, which we presented at the highest level at Expo Zaragoza (see page 14) and which has been recognised by the UN as innovative good practice, was described by the head of water for the UNEP. Veerle Vanddweerd, as «one of the best experiences on the issue of cooperation that I have seen up until now and Euskadi sets an example in this field for other world regions which should develop similar programmes».

Our active participation in the work of the United Nations Office to support the International Decade for Action 'Water for Life' 2005-2015, and in the Water group of the Spanish Coordinator of NGOs and as its representative before the EUWI (European Union Water Initiative), has allowed us to transmit plenty of knowledge, relations and opportunities to the Basque and Spanish development cooperation bodies working in relation to water.

We have directly collaborated with UNESCO to enhance the good practices of the Urdaibai Bioshere Reserve, particular the partnership with the UNESCO Chair — Biosphere Reserves, and the commitment to implement it in Latin America (there are currently three Latin American Biosphere Reserves participating in the project).

UNESCO Etxea's rich collaboration with the UNESCO Chair for Sustainability is also seen in the joint project to Evaluate Millennium Ecosystems in Bizkaia, which applies a new United Nations methodology to this territory thanks to the support of its Provincial Council.

We have continued working, always focusing on human development, in reference areas like Climate Change or Environmental Education where we have obtained the recognition of the United Nations Decade for Environmental Education for the model developed in Euskadi to which we have provided contents and training.

AWARENESS-RAISING AND EDUCATION

The KOOPERA Centre, promoted by UNESCO Etxea in collaboration with the Provincial Council of Bizkaia (Diputación Foral de Bizkaia) and Caja Laboral-Euskadiko Kutxa, is an Information and Training Centre open to the public and specialising in the United Nations System and International Cooperation.

This year's training offer consisted of 180 hours training between 5 courses, training a total of 120 people.

Courses 2008: 'Workshop on integrating the Human Rights focus into development cooperation projects', 'Human Rights protection mechanisms', 'Direct training of Aid Workers', 'Formulation of development cooperation projects and participative techniques' and 'Training in the United Nations and the Millennium Development Goals'.

Thanks to the Basque Government UN Scholarships Programme nine people have been incorporated into UNESCO Offices in seven countries in Asia, Africa and America and six others have renewed their scholarships for a second year.

Our information and orientation service has dealt with over 1,700 consultations relating to the United Nations System and development cooperation, with the main objective of providing guidance to the future professionals on these issues.

The KOOPERA centre housed the Environmental Biographies exhibition prepared by Andrew Rickard and Unesco Etxea's sustainability department which presented testimonies from people from different

countries throughout the world on the changes to their environmental setting.

As in previous years we participated in different activities of the Zero Poverty worldwide campaign organised by the Basque Country Development NGO Coordinating Committe.

We have maintained relations with different NGOs, associations and higher education centres in the Basque Autonomous Region (CAPV) which has enabled over 100 people to know our services first hand.

We coordinate the Network of UNESCO-Associated Schools in the Basque Country which aims to achieve quality education based on UNESCO's principles and ideals and which currently has 8 participating centres.

We managed the participation of two Basque centres in the Council of Europe's International Photographic Experience of Monuments. Four Basque students were awarded for their photographs of the cultural heritage in their environment and participated at an international meeting of young people held in Strasbourg where they were able to visit and find out more about the Council of Europe.

The Documentation Centre provides those interested with an extensive collection of documents specialising in the different bodies and agencies of the United Nations System.

As far as the documentation is concerned, a collection has been managed made up of over 3,201 titles and 80 periodicals; thematic dossiers on different conferences and world summits, audiovisual material, didactic material and official documentation of the United Nations System.

With over 221 new titles in 2008, the Documentation Centre is a reference in the Basque Autonomous Region for bibliographic consultations on the different working areas of the United Nations bodies and programmes.

The services offered include borrowing, 'online' consultations of the bibliographic database, consulting the UNESCO databases and the bulletins of summaries and new developments.

UNESCO ETXEA AT EXPO ZARAGOZA 2008







The International Exposition 'Water and Sustainable Development' held in Zaragoza from 14th June to 14th September, with over 5.5 million visitors and an array of events, experts, organisations and networks, was an extraordinary occasion which UNESCO Etxea took full advantage of in order to present its work and share experiences and projects.

The Expo had a Citizen Initiative Pavilion called El Faro (The Lighthouse) coordinating ideas and activities from over 350 social organisations. The Water Tribune was a more official place for reflection but was equally constructive and interesting. UNESCO Etxea actively participated at both spaces with its own events on innovative finance for the Millennium Goals and about the challenges facing the Human Right to Water. We were invited to play an active role in events organised by other local and international institutions and to top it all off we were honoured to be the only NGO in the world invited by the United Nations to present our considerations at the UN Pavilion on its official day, following the intervention of the Secretary General, Ban Ki-Moon, all in close collaboration with the International Decade for Action 'Water for Life' 2005 - 2015 and the UNESCO World Water Assessment Programme (WWAP).

The Expo, and in particular the United Nations Pavilion, was also the best scene imaginable to present the Spanish and English versions of our book 'The Human Right to Water' co-published together with the Decade for Action 'Water for Life'.

It was the international launch of our work on water which received a fantastic reception, great impact allowed us to continue learning and adding new allies.



UNESCO/BILBAO PRIZE FOR THE PROMOTION OF A CULTURE OF HUMAN RIGHTS



Transforming the old and prestigious Prize for Human Rights Education (since 1978 received by persons of the status of Václav Havel, for example) into a rejuvenated and vigorous UNESCO/Bilbao Prize for the Promotion of a Culture of Human Rights is one of UNESCO Etxea's most interesting achievement in recent years. This Prize will be awarded every two years to a person or institution which has stood out internationally due to their contribution to a Human Rights Culture. Its jury, appointed by the Director General of UNESCO, is made up of five prominent human rights promoters and defenders from different parts of the world. This prestigious jury met in Bilbao in November and decided to award the Prize to Stéphane Hessel. The international movement ATD Fourth World received an honorary mention.



Stéphane Hessel is a poet, diplomat, worker for human development (he became joint administer of the UNDP) and Human Rights activist, in the broadest sense, for over 60 years. In 1948 he was also one of the authors (the only one still alive) of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Stéphane Hessel is a venerable man who has had an extraordinary life and meeting him was one of those privileges which comes from being part of UNESCO Etxea: At 92 his life is a living lesson on optimism, commitment and vitality from someone who is still working for Human Rights. Hessel dazzled us as a wise and enthusiastic old man who is still eager to learn and surprise on a daily basis.

On 10th December 2008. International Human





Rights Day, and the 60th Anniversary of the Universal Declaration, a great event took place at the UNESCO Headquarters in Paris: Stéphane Hessel received from the Director-General of UNESCO, Koïchiro Matsuura, and the Mayor of Bilbao, Iñaki Azkuna, the UNESCO/Bilbao Prize for the Promotion of a Culture of Human Rights for his commitment to promoting a culture of human rights, justice and dignity throughout his life and his exceptional contribution to this cause, as well as «his personal participation in the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights».

The ceremony culminated with an emotional acceptance speech, a unanimous standing ovation from all those present and a privileged conclusion: Joaquín Achúcarro, UNESCO Artist for Peace, Honorary Member of UNESCO Etxea and Beloved Son of the City of Bilbao, played on the piano pieces from Albéniz and waltzes by Chopin.
